It is good to start to get to know our new brothers and sisters from East Hampton, and I thank them for their very warm welcome to me last weekend (they do a great morning tea after Mass!).

One of the things that we have not yet done very well is to begin to move around to different churches and different Mass times on the weekend. Understandably we feel a certain attachment to a place and a community, but this can also be strengthened and enlarged by getting to know others and welcoming others. It is not a case of either/or, but both/and. We can maintain our existing connections whilst trying to foster new ones. A true Christian community is opening and welcoming and inviting as Jesus was in His earthly ministry. Today's Gospel is an example of this. Stepping out of our comfort zone does mean taking a leap of faith as Zacchaeus did when he climbed the tree to see Jesus. Sometimes we find Jesus in the most unexpected ways and places when we are open to change!

This is also true when we are faced with a further change of Mass times in the coming weeks to welcome our newest community. Recently I read some words of Pope St Paul VI that may put these struggles into context for us:

All life demands struggle. Those who have everything given to them become lazy, selfish, and insensitive to the real values of life. The very striving and hard work that we so constantly try to avoid is the major building block in the person we are today.

Considerations regarding Mass Times

On Wednesday 25th October the Working Group discussed the issue of Mass times throughout our Mission. Some of the main considerations that were discussed are as follows:

The number of Masses attendees at present is less than 500 for 7 Masses - a relatively low number for the number of Masses. As such, an increase in the number of Masses seems both unnecessary and unwise. Another consideration was to be mindful of a certain equity amongst all the communities. Also noted was the workload of the priests, and doing our best to ensure that they can spend time with parishioners after Masses and not have to rush between churches.

It was suggested that a decision about Mass times be made by next weekend (5/6 Nov) and the transition introduced by Advent (26/27 Nov)

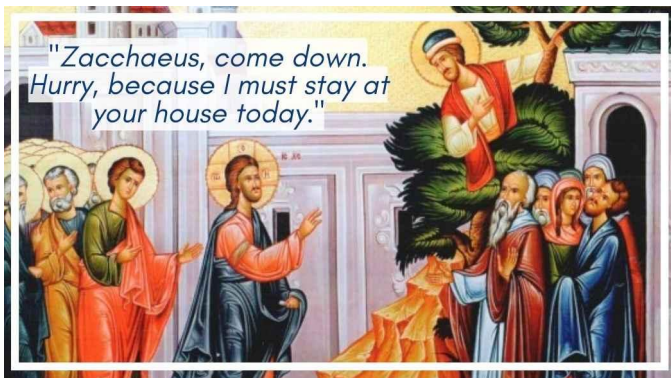

NOVEMBER

In our Catholic tradition, November is traditionally the time we recall and pray for those who have died. In our churches, there is a Book of the Dead where you can write the names of your loved one and those who you would like to have prayed for during this month.

Attached to the bulletin this week is a 'November Mass' envelope to have Masses offered for those who have died. You can indicate their names on the back of the envelope. These envelopes can be placed in the collections at Mass or handed into the Bayside office or given to the priests. Of your charity, please also recall those who have nobody to pray for them during this month. These November Masses will be offered by the priests of the parish, and other priests during the coming months.

All Saints' and All Souls' Day

In the Catholic tradition, November is traditionally a month of remembrance of the dead. The month begins with the Solemnity of All Saints on 1 November and the Commemoration of the All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day), on 2 November. The Church has consistently encouraged prayers for the faithful departed and, during November, a list of the names of the dead is usually placed in the church so that the community can remember them in prayer.

All Saints' Day

All Saints' Day commemorates all the saints in heaven. The liturgical celebration on the day before the feast became known as hallowed evening or Hallowe'en. All Saints Day represents the desire of the faithful to commemorate all saints, *'great multitude which no man could number'* (Revelation 7:9), especially those who have no proper feast day of their own.

All Saints' Day is a time to consider the example saints offer us and to reflect on how we can imitate their lives. As Pope Benedict XVI said, All Saints' Day calls us *'to see the Church... as Christ wanted it, that is, as the communion of saints.'*

All Souls' Day

All Souls' Day follows All Saints Day on 2 November and is also known as the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed and the Day of the Dead. It is a day of prayer and remembrance for the souls of those who have died.

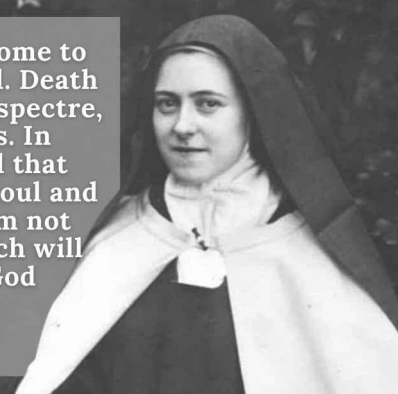
The day is dedicated to prayer and remembrance, with requiem Masses held. A plenary indulgence may be gained for the dead on All Souls' Day, by visiting a Church and praying the Lord's Prayer and the Creed. There are three conditions to gaining a plenary indulgence: sacramental confession, eucharistic communion and prayer for the pope's intentions.

Many people also visit and sometimes decorate the graves of deceased loved ones on All Souls' Day and throughout the month of November.
