Dear friends

For the past two weeks in the bulletin we have asked you to begin to reflect and offer your thoughts about our priorities for the coming year in the Mission. Our local teams have also been consulting our communities about this. Please continue to give this some thought and prayer and offer your suggestions so that they can be discussed at the December meeting of the Bayside Pastoral Council.

We have also been consulting our local teams about providing a review of the Bayside Mission after one year, with your observations, suggestions and opinions, to offer to the Archbishop. We aim to have this review done by mid October, so if you have anything you would like to offer please contact a member of your local team or forward them directly to the Bayside office at [baysideoffice@cam.org.au](mailto:baysideoffice@cam.org.au). In thinking about this, you might like to consider things such as: Preparation for the Mission; Implementation of the Mission; Challenges; Benefits; Suggestions for the future; what could be done differently and what was helpful. Thanks to those who have already offered their observations. Once the responses are collated, they will be forwarded to the Archbishop and a copy available for all of us to read as well. Whilst it can be helpful to look back to see where we have come from, our focus as Christians is for the present and the future. We live as Christians now in this world, in the hope of a better life to come. We are people of hope.

You will notice some new things happening this week: the new Safeguarding section on the website; Evening Prayer of the Church (Vespers) commencing online this coming Thursday as well as the regular weekly events which are listed in the bulletin. Engaging online is no substitute for personal connections and interactions, but sadly it is the best we can do at the moment.

Last Monday was the Feast of St John XXIII, the Pope who convoked Vatican II. It was also the first working day of the first session of the Australian Plenary Council which concluded last week. Perhaps the words of St John XXIII at the opening of Vatican II can be a good reminder for us as to what our focus should be at this time in Bayside and beyond.

*In these days, which mark the beginning of this Second Vatican Council, it is more obvious than ever before that the Lord's truth is indeed eternal. Human ideologies change. Successive generations give rise to varying errors, and these often vanish as quickly as they came, like mist before the sun.*

*The great desire of the Catholic Church in raising aloft at this Council the torch of truth, is to show herself to the world as the loving mother of all mankind; gentle, patient, and full of tenderness and sympathy for her separated children.*

*Everywhere, through her children, she extends the frontiers of Christian love, the most powerful means of eradicating the seeds of discord, the most effective means of promoting concord, peace with justice, and universal brotherhood.*

May the Lord continue to bless you and your loved ones.

## Scripture Reflection

The sons of Zebedee hardly know what they're asking in today's Gospel. They are thinking in terms of how the Gentiles rule, of royal privileges and honors.

But the road to Christ's kingdom is by way of His Cross. To share in His glory, we must be willing to drink the cup that He drinks.

The cup is an Old Testament image for God's judgment. The wicked would be made to drink this cup in punishment for their sins (see Psalm 75:9; Jeremiah 25:15, 28; Isaiah 51:17). But Jesus has come to drink this cup on behalf of all humanity. He has come to be baptized—which means plunged or immersed—into the sufferings we all deserve for our sins (compare Luke 12:50).

In this He will fulfill the task of Isaiah's suffering servant, whom we read about in today's First Reading.

Like Isaiah's servant, the Son of Man will give His life as an offering for sin, as once Israel's priests offered sacrifices for the sins of the people (see Leviticus 5:17-19).

Jesus is the heavenly high priest of all humanity, as we hear in today's Epistle. Israel's high priests offered the blood of goats and calves in the temple sanctuary. But Jesus entered the heavenly sanctuary with His own blood (see Hebrews 9:12).

And by bearing our guilt and offering His life to do the will of God, Jesus ransomed "the many"—paying the price to redeem humanity from spiritual slavery to sin and death.

He has delivered us from death, as we rejoice in today's Psalm.

We need to hold fast to our confession of faith, as today's Epistle exhorts us. We must look upon our trials and sufferings as our portion of the cup He promised to those who believe in Him (see Colossians 1:24). We must remember that we have been baptized into His passion and death (see Romans 6:3).

In confidence, let us approach the altar today, the throne of grace, at which we drink the cup of His saving blood (see Mark 14:23-24).


## St Luke, Evangelist- Feast Day 18th October


St Luke wrote a greater volume of the New Testament than any other single author, including the earliest history of the Church. Ancient traditions also acknowledge Luke as the founder of Christian iconography, making him a patron of artists as well as doctors and other medical caregivers.

Luke came from the large metropolitan city of Antioch, a part of modern-day Turkey. Educated as a physician in the Greek-speaking city, Luke was among the most cultured and cosmopolitan members of the early Church. Luke's writings incorporate the personal testimony of the Blessed Virgin Mary, whose role in Christ's life emerges most clearly in his gospel. Tradition credits him with painting several icons of Christ's mother, and one of the sacred portraits ascribed to him - known by the title "Salvation of the Roman People"-- survives to this day in the Basilica of St. Mary Major.

Some traditions hold that Luke became a direct disciple of Jesus before his ascension, while others hold that he became a believer only afterward. After St Paul's conversion, Luke accompanied him as his personal physician-- and, in effect, as a kind of biographer, since the journeys of Paul on which Luke accompanied him occupy a large portion of the Acts of the Apostles. Luke was also among the only companions of Paul who did not abandon him during his final imprisonment and death in Rome. After the martyrdom of St Paul in the year 67, St Luke is said to have preached elsewhere throughout the Mediterranean, and possibly died as a martyr.
