Dear friends

We know how the disciples felt in today's Gospel! The wind is blowing, everything is uncertain, and we are going to a different place across the lake.

Sounds like our life amidst Covid. Where do we go from here? Things change all the time. Some people become anxious or afraid, like the disciples. Some people become angry and upset, and others try to ignore it.

Closer to home, we can express similar feelings about our move into the Bayside Mission. Although it has been nearly a year, things still seem uncertain and we experience some loss, grief and change, and uncertainty.

So the Gospel today speaks to us in both scenarios. Covid and Bayside. Jesus is in control. 'Why are you so frightened?', 'How is it that you have no faith?'

Whatever changes occur we have the comfort that Jesus is 'in the boat' with us. It is a call to trust and to go forward in hope in changing times.

Jesus took his disciples in the boat and crossed over to the other side, leaving the crowds behind him. It would have been safe to stay where they were and not enter onto the lake with the storms. But weathering the storms are part of our Christian life, and inviting us to further trust that the Lord is guiding us in Bayside and beyond.

## Gospel Reflection

"Do you not yet have faith?" Our Lord's question in today's Gospel frames the Sunday liturgies for the remainder of the year, which the Church calls "Ordinary Time."

In the weeks ahead, the Church's liturgy will have us journeying with Jesus and His disciples, reliving their experience of His words and deeds, coming to know and believe in Him as they did.

Notice that today's Psalm almost provides an outline for the Gospel. We sing of sailors caught in a storm; in their desperation, they call to the Lord and He rescues them.

Mark's Gospel today also intends us to hear a strong echo of the story of the prophet Jonah. He, too, was found asleep on a boat when a life-threatening storm broke out that caused his fellow travelers to pray for deliverance, and then to marvel when the storm abated (see Jonah 1:3-16).

But Jesus is something greater than Jonah (see Matthew 12:41). And Mark wants us to come to see what the Apostles saw—that God alone has the power to rebuke the wind and the sea (see Isaiah 50:2; Psalm 18:16). This is the point of today's First Reading.

If even the wind and sea obey Him, shouldn't we trust Him in the chaos and storms of our own lives?

As with the Apostles, the Lord has asked each of us to cross to the other side, to leave behind our old ways to travel with Him in the little ship of the Church.


In their fear today, they call Him, "Teacher." And it is only faith in His teaching that can save us from perishing. We should trust in Christ, and trust like Christ—who was able to sleep through the storm, confident that God was with Him (see Psalm 116:6; Romans 8:31).

We should live in thanksgiving for our salvation, as today's Epistle tells us—as new creations, no longer for ourselves but for Him who died for our sake.

## The Nativity of St John The Baptist Feast Day 24th June

John the Baptist was born through the intercession of God to Zachariah and Elizabeth, who was too old to bear children.



The Angel Gabriel visited Elizabeth and Zachariah to tell them they would have a son and that they should name him John. Zachariah was skeptical and for this he was rendered mute until the time his son was born and named John, in fulfillment of God's will.

When Elizabeth was pregnant with John, she was visited by Mary, and John leapt in her womb. This revealed to Elizabeth that the child Mary carried was to be the Son of God. John began public ministry around 30 AD, and was known for attracting large crowds across the province of Judaea and around the Jordan River. When Jesus came to him to be baptized, John recognized him and said, "It is I who need baptism from you."

Jesus told John to baptize Him anyway, which he did, whereupon the heavens opened, and the Spirit of God was seen like a dove. The voice of God spoke, saying, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." John instructed his followers to turn to Christ, calling Him the "Lamb of God" and these people were among the first Christians.

Following his baptism of Christ, John's popularity grew so much that he alarmed King Herod. Herod ordered him arrested and imprisoned. John condemned Herod's marriage to his half-brother's wife. In revenge for John the Baptist's condemnation of her mother's scandalous marriage to Herod, she asked for John's head. King Herod reluctantly obliged. John the Baptist died sometime between 33 and 36 AD.
